Intermediate Level Games 17-24

n reading, pronunciation, and spelling instruction, the Intermediate Level of phonicspelling Bingo Sound/Spelling Picture Board Games supplements the teaching/learning of one-syllable vocab items with regular spellings. It consists of:

- ♦ EIGHT (8) DIFFERENT GAMES. Each game has 25 vocabulary items with distinct sound and spelling contrasts. Games 17-20 focus on vowel sounds and spellings. Games 21-24 present consonant-sound contrasts in initial and final word positions. At the bottom of each board is a sound-spelling correlation chart with both American dictionary and International Phonetic Alphabet symbols.
- ◆ EIGHT (8) SHEETS OF "CALLER CARDS," ONE FOR EACH GAME.

 Each sheet of "Caller Cards" can be cut into 25 separate boxes, to be used in various ways for several kinds of "Lotto" or "Bingo" games.
- ◆ TEN (10) SEPARATE BINGO BOARDS FOR EACH GAME. Ten individuals, pairs of learners, or even teams can play one game at the same time. In large classes, groups can use separate sets of Bingo Boards to play different games at the same time.
- ◆ THIS PHONICS BINGO INSTRUCTION BOOK. This resource book contains not only suggestions for use of the Intermediate-Level Phonics Bingo Sound/Spelling Picture Board Games. It also offers:
 - [1] teacher and learner information about the phonics, pronunciation, and spelling systems of standard American English,
 - [2] a large variety of innovative ideas for preparation and follow-up activities for *Phonics Bingo Games*, and
 - [3] *Phonics Sound/Spelling Charts*, exercises, and testing materials—reproducible for individual learners


Which items are on the *Intermediate Level* phonicspelling *Bingo* Boards and Caller Cards?

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL GAME 17. BOARD A CONTRASTS IN SIMPLE VOWEL SOUNDS & SPELLINGS





The first game of each level of Phonics Bingo contrasts the spellings of "simple vowel sounds," also called "lax" or "short" vowels, each pronounced with the tongue at a different place in the mouth. The second game presents the spellings of "complex vowel sounds," also known as "tense" or "long" vowels or "diphthongs." Many of these are pronounced as "glides," as the tongue moves from one position in the mouth to another.



Intermediate Level game 19. Board a Contrasts in All Vowel Sounds & Spellings





The next two games of each level of Phonics Bingo contrast the spellings of both "simple" and "complex" vowel sounds. Most "simple" vowel sounds are written with one vowel letter only, before one or more final consonants. There are two common ways of spelling "complex" vowel sounds: [1] With two vowel letters together, or [2] with one vowel letter in the middle of the word and a final silent -e after one or more consonant letters. Typically, the sound is pronounced like the name of the first vowel letter.



CONTRASTS IN ALL VOWEL SOUNDS & Spellings





The Intermediate-Level Phonics Bingo Games display mostly one-syllable items — some with the most common spellings and others with less frequent—but still "regular" —combinations of letters. Exceptions to the phonics patterns are included in the Advanced Level, in both one-syllable and multi-syllable items.



Intermediate-Level Game 21 presents contrasts among initial consonant sounds and combinations (blends or clusters) in rhyming and similar-sounding words. After the beginning consonant sound(s), all the words contain the /ē/ or / č/ vowel sounds. They all end in /d/ or /t/. Not all possible consonant sound combinations are on the boards, and the spellings that appear are the most frequent. Other possible spellings for these sounds in initial positions are included in the sound-spelling chart at the bottom.



CONTRASTS IN INITIAL CONSONANT Sounds & Spellings





Intermediate-Level Game 22 presents more contrasts among initial consonant sounds and combinations (blends or clusters) in rhyming and similar-sounding words. After the beginning consonant sound(s), all the words contain the complex $/\bar{a}/$ or $/\bar{e}/$ vowel sounds before /r/. A few two-syllable words are included.

Intermediate Level Game 23 offers contrasts among final consonant sounds and combinations. It includes most voiced-voiceless pairs—/b/ vs. /p/, /d/ vs. /t/, /g/ vs. /k/, /v/ vs. /f/. /th/ vs. /th/, /z/ vs. /s/, and /ch/ vs. /j/.—and the voiced sounds /m n ng l r/. The sounds in each pair are pronounced exactly the same except that the first involves the use of the vocal cords (voicing), and the second does not. The vowel sounds of words ending in voiced consonants should take more time to pronounce (sound "longer") than the vowels of words with voiceless sounds at the end.

Intermediate-Level Game 24 shows more contrasts among final consonant sounds and combinations. The same voiced-voiceless pairs appear as in the previous game, but they are often together with other consonant sounds.

There are also words that include an added syllable for the plural ending—as well as words that simply add the /z/ or /s/ sound. There are also some regular past-tense verb forms and a two-syllable compound word.
